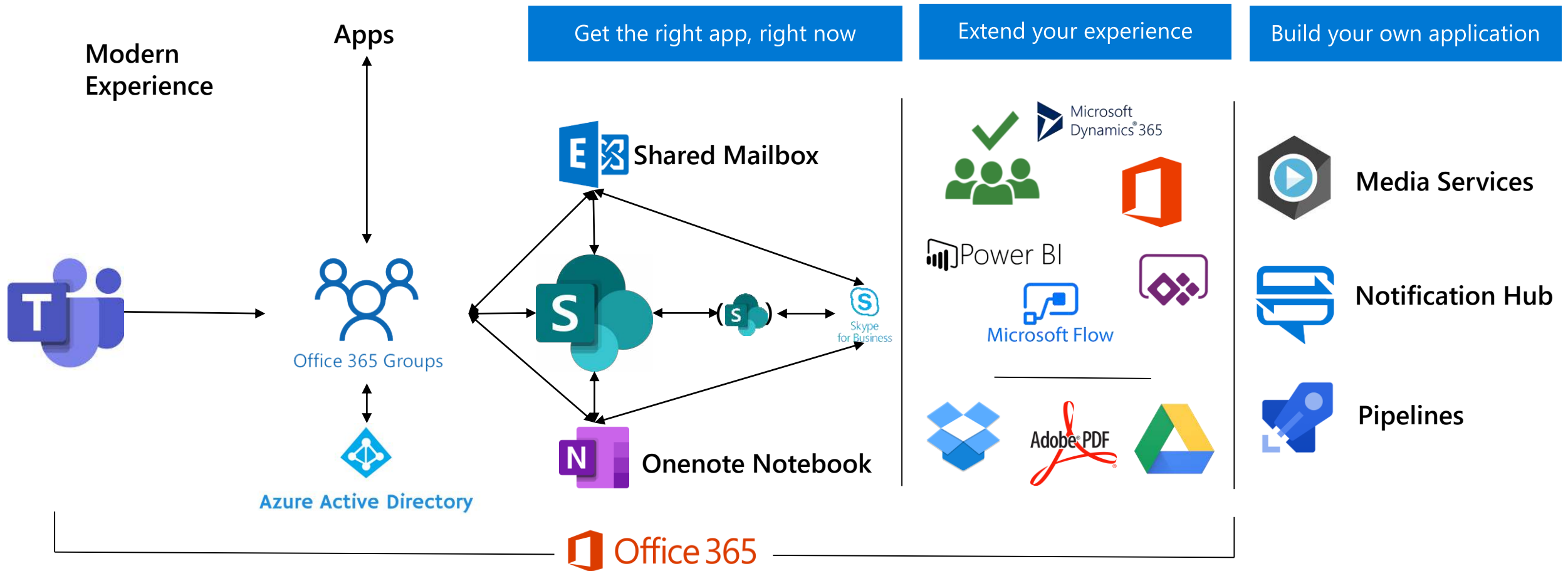

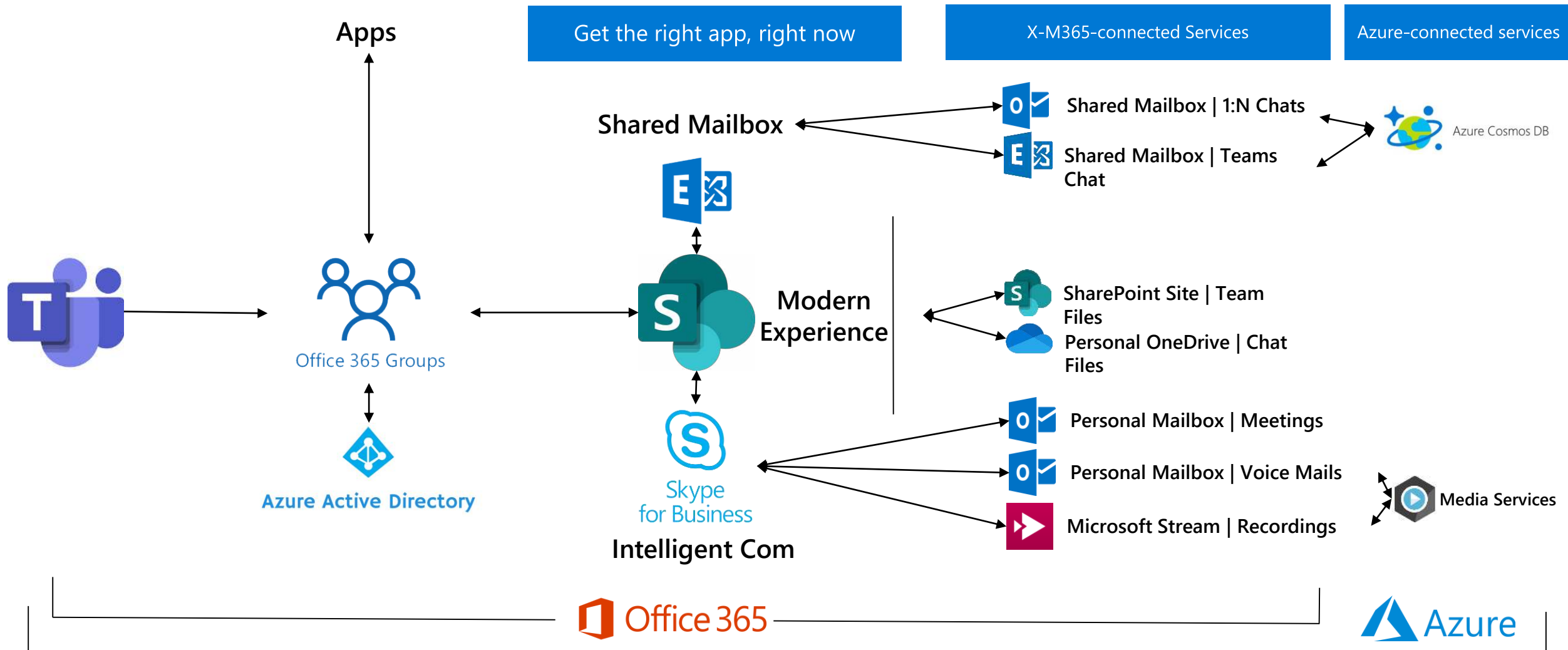

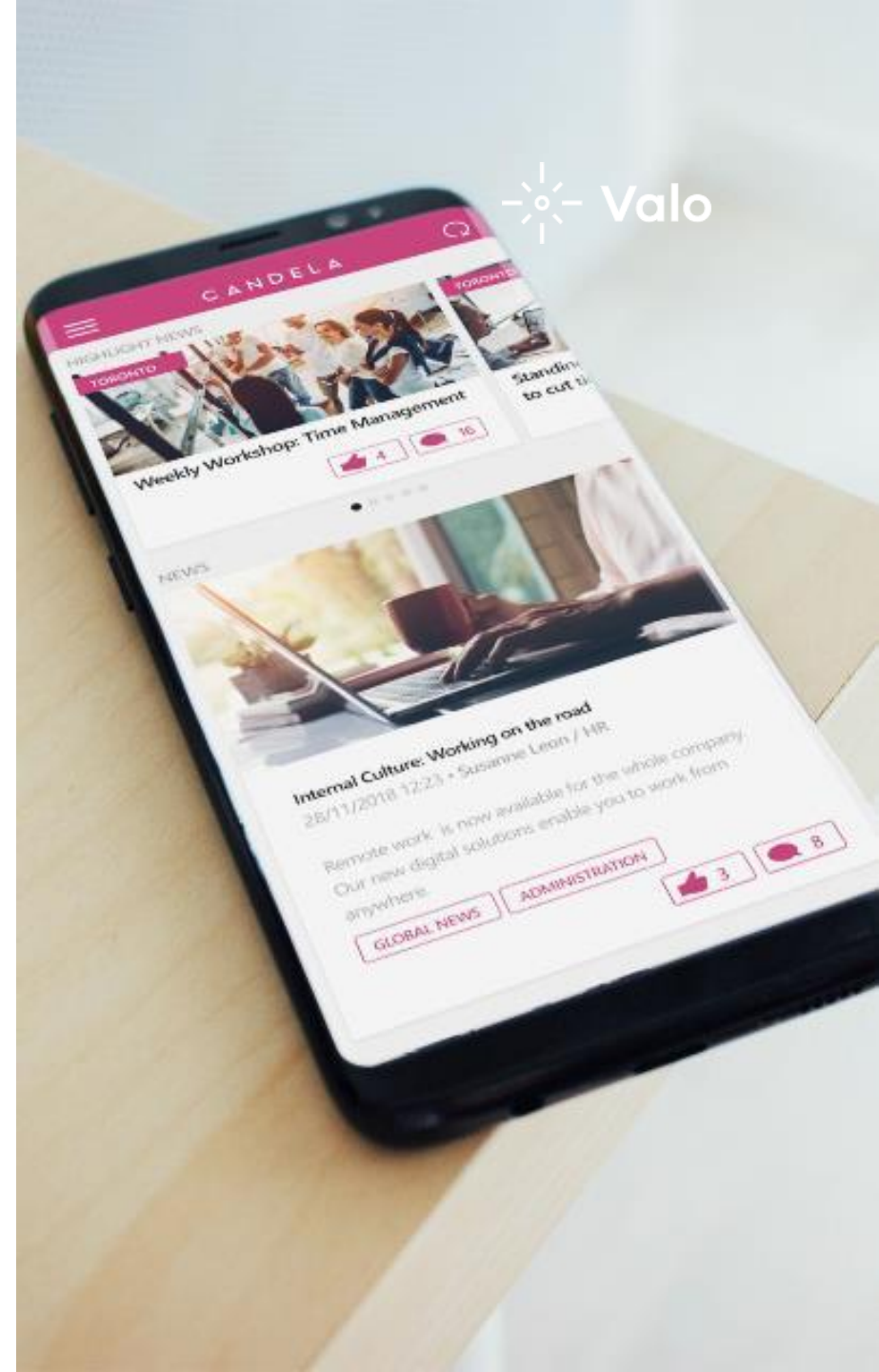
# Why need for Microsoft Teams

- On-premises is still complicated (think Certificates, FBA, VPN)
- <!-- Cloud offerings (think OneDrive)
- <!-- Cloud innovations (think AI, Delve)
- <!-- Cloud Transformations (think PowerApps, Flow)
- Prepare minds for the cloud (think culture shift)
- Need for a secure, scalable and flexible HUB for Digital Transformation



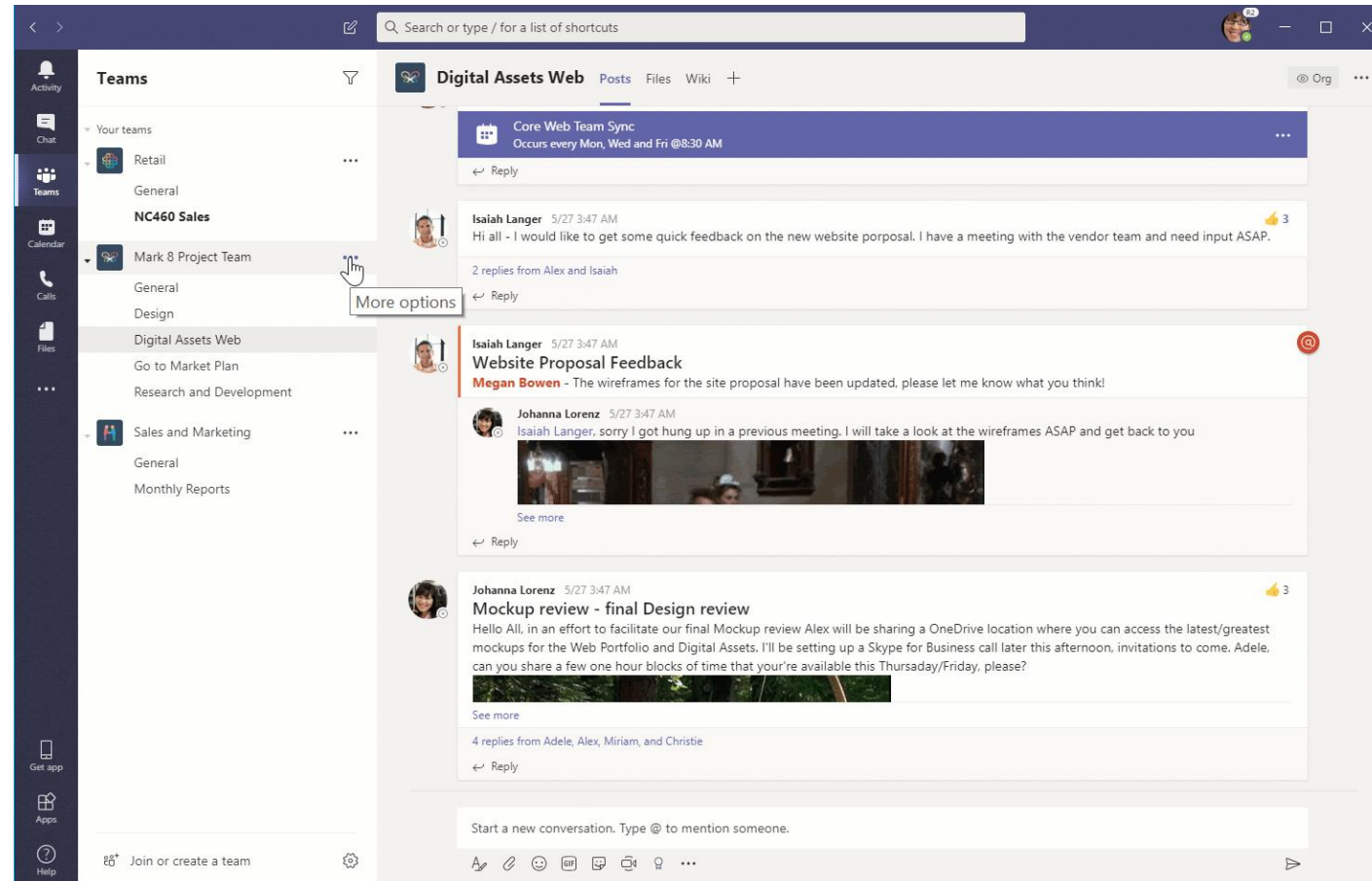
# Why need for Microsoft Teams

- Extremely fast *\_provisioning\_* of new workloads
- The Intelligent *\_Bot\_* Ecosystem
- Productivity gains and enriched communication: *\_Integration\_* of all stacks in one single place (From any device, any place, and with anyone)
- Technical agility. (Can add capacity and flexibility to scale up quickly)
- Anytime, anywhere access
- Very *\_Rapid\_* feature-proof deployment (Adoption?)



# Private Channels... Released

- SharePoint is still the key factor
  - Private Site Collection
  - Managed by Microsoft Teams
  - Container for Library
  - No Pages support
- Currently, private channels support connectors and tabs (except Stream, Planner, and Forms).
- Each team can have a maximum of 30 private channels
- each private channel can have a maximum of 250 members.
- The 30 private channel limit is in addition to the 200 standard channel limit per team.

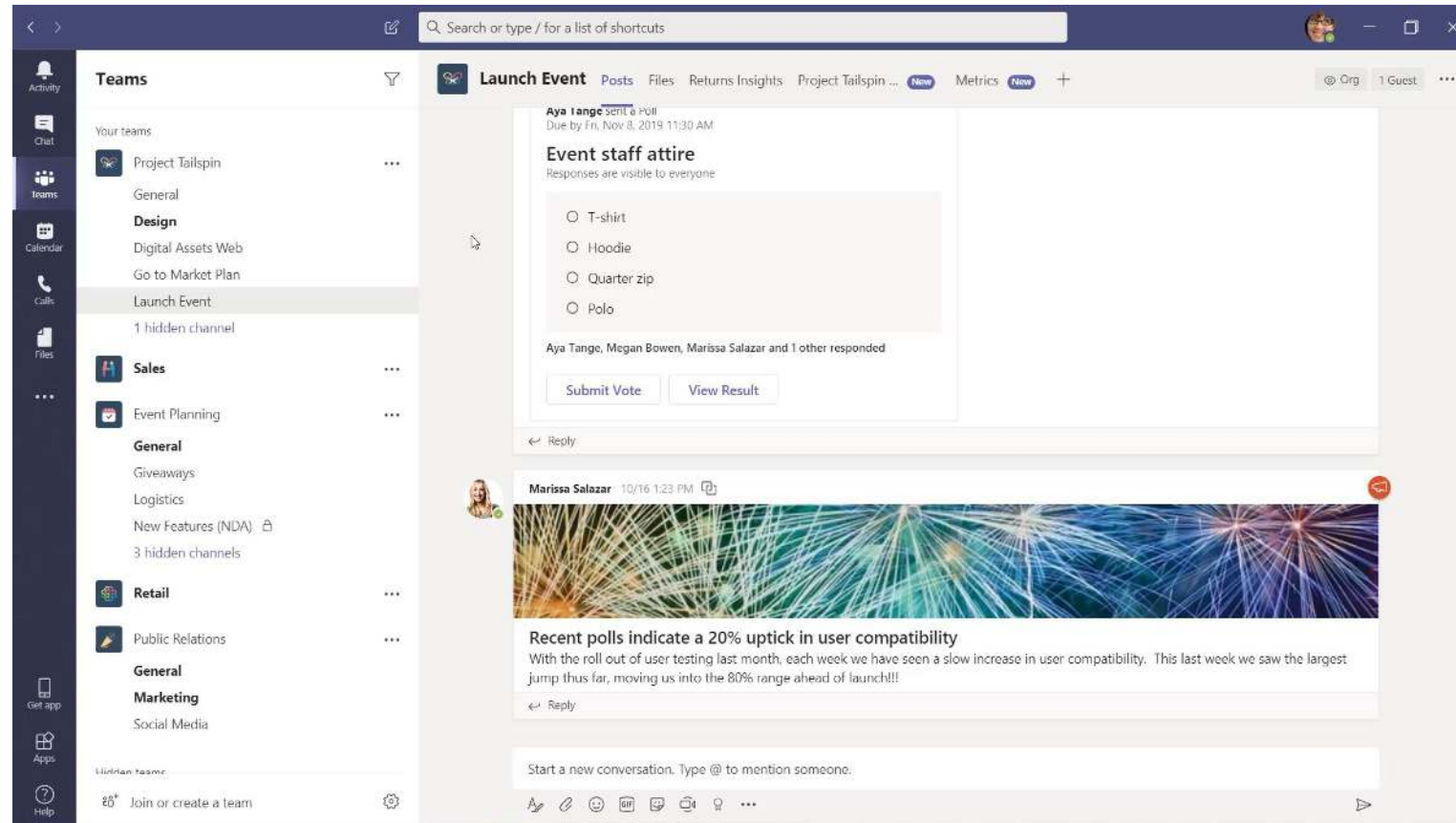


# Multi Windows Capabilities.. Soon

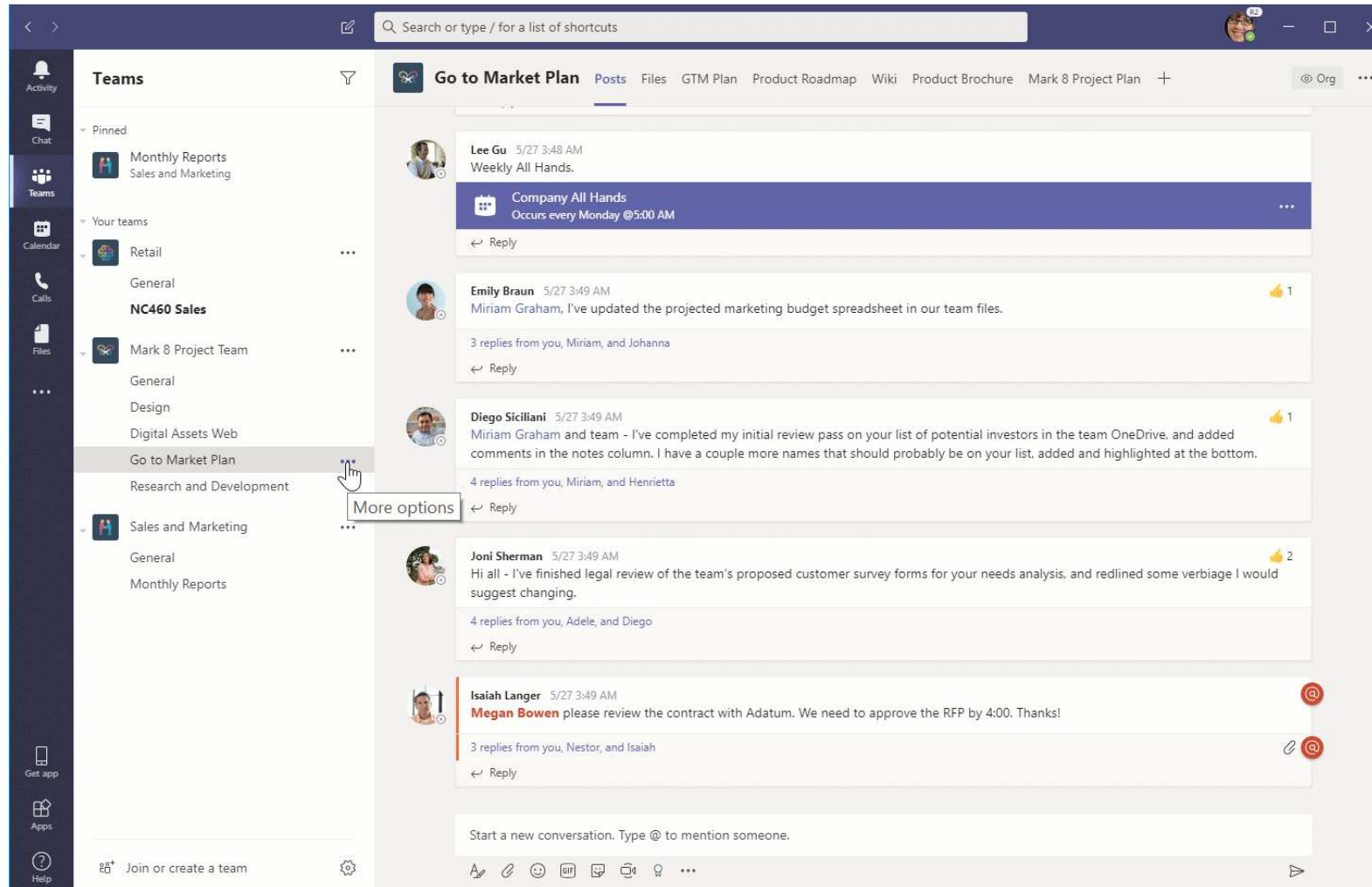
+ Multiwindow capability provides users the option to pop out:

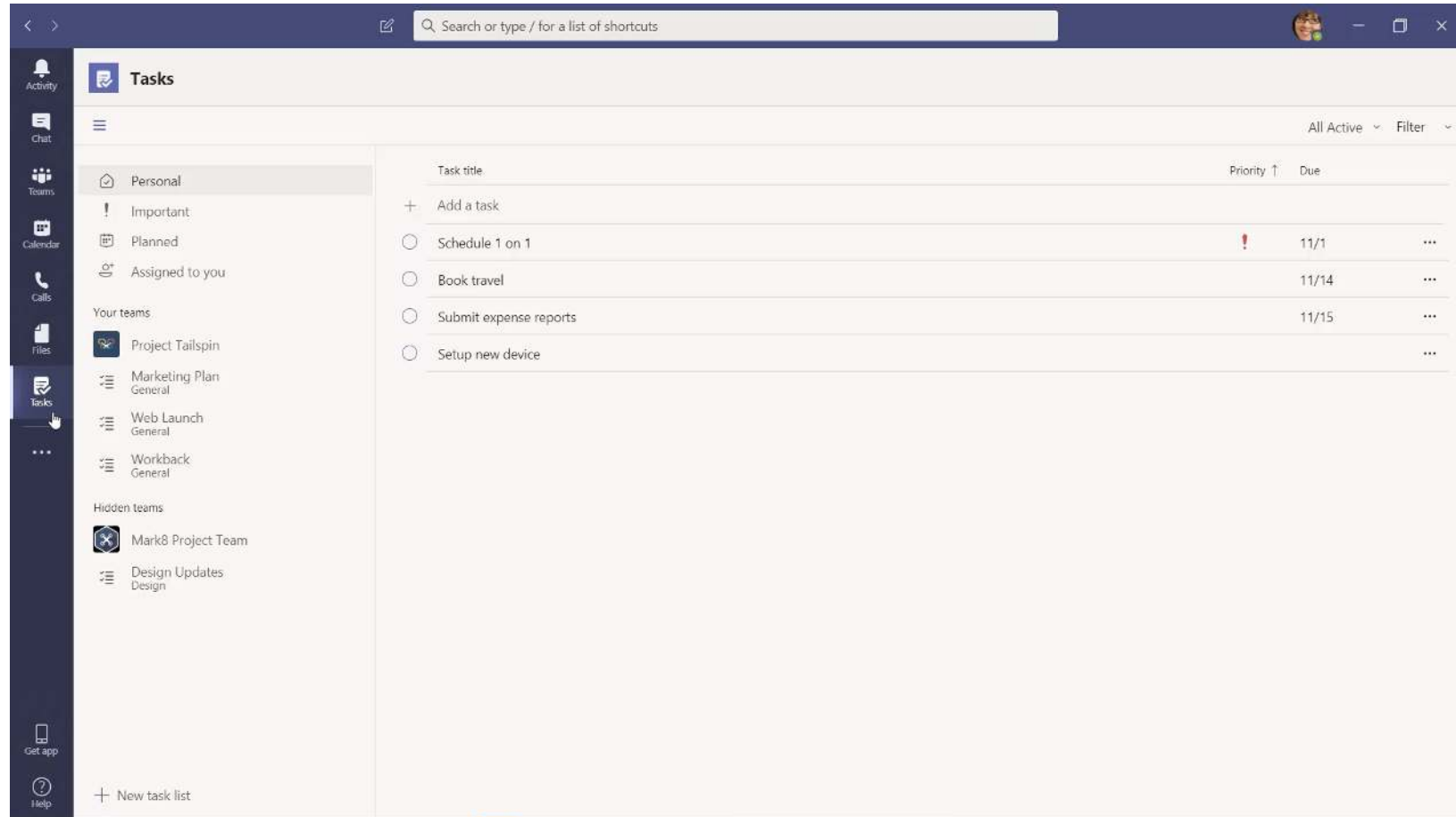

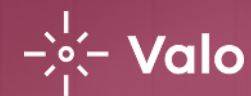

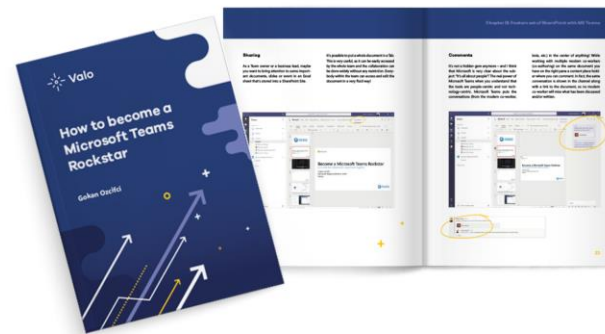
